a. Space Park Leicester would like to announce the Launch of **Space Missions: The Executive Guide to Space**

b. **Airbus Launchpad** opens in Stevenage

A new facility designed to help small businesses thrive in the UK space sector has opened at Airbus Defence and Space's Stevenage site, backed by £3.9 million from the UK Space Agency.

The Airbus Launchpad will provide SMEs, start-ups and research organisations with access to laboratories, workspaces and testing facilities through a no-cost residency programme. The facility can accommodate over 50 people and aims to strengthen the UK space supply chain while developing homegrown skills and capabilities.

The UK Space Agency funding comes from the Space Clusters Infrastructure Fund and was match-funded by Airbus. Three companies – Applied Atomics, Spintex and Stars Edge – have taken up residence from early February.

d. Government responds to space economy report recommendations

The Government has published its response to the House of Lords UK Engagement with Space Committee Report, '**The Space Economy: Act Now or Lose Out**'.

It acknowledges that Space is 'fundamental to the UK's prosperity, security and global influence, with space-based services and data underpinning components of the UK's critical national infrastructure' and its pivotal role in national security and underpinning 'essential services across communications, navigation, finance, energy, and emergency response'. And there are specific responses to the recommendations in the report, which was published in November 2025.

4. Funding and Support Opportunities

a. **NEW! Advanced manufacturing supply chains - Feasibility studies**, UKRI

UK registered businesses and Research and Technology Organisations (RTOs) can apply for a share of up to £5m to deliver feasibility studies that will help make supply chains more resource-efficient and resilient.

Funding of £50k - £100k is available for projects up to nine months in duration, supporting the development of cutting-edge technologies with broad cross-sector application and significant potential impact for UK and global industry.

This competition focuses on tackling cross-cutting challenges across six high-growth sectors: Advanced manufacturing, clean energy industries, creative industries, defence, digital and technologies, and life sciences. It also covers key advanced manufacturing frontier industries, including automotive, batteries and energy storage, aerospace, advanced materials, agritech, and **space**.

Two interactive drop-in sessions are planned, giving you the chance to discuss your project ideas, clarify requirements and identify potential collaborators:

b. **Accelerating Investment Export Pathway**

This is a UK Space Agency programme, supported by KPMG, that is specifically designed to support high-potential, early-stage UK space businesses in expanding into international markets.

The programme offers:

- **Targeted Training:** Practical workshops on market entry strategies, international procurement, and export readiness, tailored for the space sector.
- **Expert Guidance:** Support from leading technical experts and international market specialists.
- **Global Reach:** Preparation for Department for Business and Trade missions and navigating complex international trade landscapes.

c. The ESA Proposal Advice Service (ESA PAS)

Designed to support UK-based organisations bidding for European Space Agency contracts and improve the quality, completeness, strategic alignment and consistency of bids - thereby aiming to strengthen the bidder's application for funding - by providing free, non-technical advice to organisations through a thorough review of their draft bid (before submission).

d. UK Innovation Science Seed Fund (UKI2S)

UKI2S focuses on nurturing and adding value to innovative ideas that shape the future alongside investing in groundbreaking technology companies. UKI2S invests in innovations that are in the UKIS strategic priority areas or from the UK's publicly funded science and knowledge base. They focus on those with high growth potential at pre-seed and seed stages – to get the most groundbreaking technologies and ideas to market.

e. Made Smarter

The "Made Smarter" program offers funding and support to UK manufacturers, particularly SMEs, to help them adopt digital technologies and improve their operations. This includes match-funded grants of up to 50% (with a maximum of £20,000) for equipment and/or advice to implement projects, as well as access to digital technology advice and workforce development

f. Cyber security consultancy support, plus assessment and certification

Successful applicants can receive up to 3 days consultation from a cybersecurity professional funded by the UK Space Agency. This can be virtual or at a place of business (UK), depending on requirements.
